



District of Taylor Official Community Plan What We Heard: ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

July 2023



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Introduction

The District of Taylor is undertaking a planning process to update the Official Community Plan that captures and reflects the community's vision, goals, and priorities. An Official Community Plan is a future-oriented document that informs and guides how a community will grow for the next 15+ years. It is the highest-level policy document for a local government, and it includes policies on the growth and development of the community on topics such as land use, economic development, infrastructure and social-well-being.

The District's current Official Community Plan was last adopted in 2014. Generally, an Official Community Plans is reviewed, and if necessary, updated, every five to seven years. This allows the District to ensure the vision for the community is still relevant and reflects the needs of its residents, and that polices in the Official Community Plan are modern, reflect recent legislative changes, and continue to set the community up for success.

This report summarizes the input provided by the community during the first round of engagement, which occurred between May and June of 2023. The information collected and the identified themes will be used to guide the updates to the current Official Community Plan for the District of Taylor.

Engagement Overview

In-person public and stakeholder engagement was conducted in order to gather input from the community to ensure that the plan serves the community. Residents were provided numerous opportunities and ways to provide their input.

The online engagement consisted of a survey that was available from the end of May to early July. The survey allowed stakeholders and community members who were not available to attend in-person engagements to provide input. The project team visited Taylor May 15th, May 31st, June 3rd, June 6th, June 21st and June 30th to help facilitate in-person public and stakeholder engagement events.

Summary of Engagement Themes

When analyzing the results from the engagement activities and survey responses, the following overarching themes emerged:

- Residents enjoy living in a small, quiet community which has access to recreational amenities, and community events;
- Residents desire more amenities (grocery store, small local shops, medical clinic), improved infrastructure (pedestrian crossings, more streetlights and crosswalks), new recreation infrastructure (spray park, outdoor pool, trails, dog park) and increased safety (traffic speeds on the highway, police presence);
- There was a desire to have increased connection through the community by having community events and opportunities/spaces for social gathering (coffee shop); and
- Social needs and culture, parks and recreation opportunities, economic development, emergency
 preparedness, and agriculture and local food systems were identified as the main areas
 participants would like the District to focus on.

Draft Vision

Based off the engagement from the public a proposed vision statement for Taylor is:

"Taylor is a thriving, friendly and welcoming multi-generational community that celebrates its small town spirit, unique history and heritage, while enhancing its strong community bonds and quality of life.

By being able to provide a high level of amenities and activities, Taylor promotes economic growth, recreational participation and community involvement.

Taylor strives to be a highly desirable place to live, work and play, and aspires to become more socially, environmentally, culturally and economically diverse."

What We Heard

Collected verbatim responses from the workshop and public engagement events can be found in Appendix A.

Staff and Council Workshop

On May 15th, the project team held a workshop with both staff and council. Following a brief presentation on what an Official Community Plan, and the roles of staff and council in the process, participants worked through the same stations, maps and money jar activities that were used in the public engagement events. This workshop provided staff and council with an opportunity to provide their personal input, ask questions and discuss the future of the District. The feedback provided was incorporated into the public engagement responses.

Public Engagement Events

The project team facilitated five public engagement events including a Community Open House and four pop-up events that were open to the public to drop by and provide input. The first pop-up was at the



Taylor Hill Climb on June 3rd, followed by a pop-up at Lone Wolf Golf Course on June 6th, a meeting with Grey Matters on June 21st and lastly a pop-up at Show and Shine on June 30th.

The project team was able to reach 15 participants at the open house, approximately 30 at the Hill Climb pop-up tent, 6 at the Lone Wolf pop-up tent, approximately 13 at Grey Matters, and 12 at the Show N' Shine pop-up tent. The online survey had 71 participants in total.

The engagement panels on display at the public engagement events provided information on the project and asked participants to answer questions on high level visioning for the future of Taylor. Participants were asked to write their answers down by placing sticky notes, writing, or drawing directly on the panels or placing check marks next to ideas they liked the most. In addition, the survey was available at all the engagement events in an online and paper format.









Participants were also provided two maps of the District of Taylor that outlined the municipal boundary; one had an aerial view and the other showed the current land-use designations. The main responses from the map are increased housing development, commercial development, recreation spots, (dog park, spray park, basketball courts) and connections across the highway (crosswalks).



Finding a Balance Budget Exercise

A popular activity that was enjoyed by participants was the Finding a Balance, or 'money jars'. The activity had participants identify which parts of the Official Community Plan they think needs to be focused on and where residents want budgets to be allocated on those things that Taylor is able to put financial resources towards. It was emphasized that this activity speaks to those items that are within the Districts' jurisdiction/control. Each person was given a set amount of play money that they divided between the different jars. The jars were labeled with the different categories (district administration, bylaw enforcement, arts, culture and heritage, affordable housing, infrastructure etc.). There was an 'other' jar where participants could write down what other areas they wanted the money put towards.

Virtual Engagement - Online Survey


A total of 71 participants completed the online survey. The survey contained 20 questions with a mix of multiple choice, open-ended, and rating scale. For some questions, respondents were asked to 'rank the following in order of priority,' and/or 'select all that apply.' The open-ended questions gave respondents a chance to share their hope for Taylor in the future, what they would like to make sure is present, what to change for the better, and what they picture Taylor being in 2040. All survey questions except the first, in which it asks where the respondent lives, were optional and not all respondents answered every question. The number of total responses per question is noted. A summary of the feedback on the main questions is presented below, and the verbatim survey responses for all 20 questions can be found in Appendix B.

Q. In general, how would you rate the overall quality of life in the District of Taylor today?



Q. In the past 5 years, would you say the quality of life in the District of Taylor has:



Q. In general, how would you rate the District of Taylor as a place in which to raise a family?



Q. In general, how would you rate the District of Taylor as a place in which to retire?



This was an open-ended question and one that was included in the public engagement panels. The main responses were the small community feel, community events and recreation amenities available.

This was also an open-ended question and one that was included in the public engagement panels. The main responses were increased commercial development and services, senior's housing, preschool, and more recreation services and infrastructure.




Q. When picturing the future of the District of Taylor in 2040, what is one word or phrase that comes to mind?




Participants were asked to rank the 10 areas of focus. Social needs and culture, parks and recreation opportunities, economic development, emergency preparedness and agriculture and local food systems were identified as the top five areas that the District should focus on.

Participants were asked to rank a number of identified issues. The responses for each issue were added together and an average was taken. Air quality, renewable energy, energy conservation, protecting forests and wildlife, and protection of agricultural lands were the top five issues identified as what the District should address.



Q. What transportation infrastructure would you like to see developed for 2040? Please use the arrows to rank the following in order of priority.

(52 participants answered)

Participants were asked to rank different types of transportation in order of priority. The responses for each transportation infrastructure option were added together and an average was taken. Pedestrian facilities (i.e., sidewalks, crosswalks) was ranked as the highest priority for the district, followed by more local transit options, more regional transit options, shuttle buses, cycling infrastructure.

Conclusion

Overall, we received positive feedback from participants in how they envision Taylor in 2040, and what they enjoy in the present. It was highlighted the community is very proud of Taylor and wish to see it thrive in the future. The feedback provided by participants through the engagement events and surveys will be used to form and guide the policy updates to the Official Community Plan.











Q19 How long you have lived in the District?


